LEADERSHIP

District President

On a yearly basis, or as the constitution allows, the District NYI (DNYI) elects its president. There are some minimal expectations placed on the DNYI President:

- 1. To give leadership to the DNYI Council meetings.
- 2. To recruit spirit filled leaders for the continuation, development, and furtherance of the programs of the DNYI.
- 3. To participate in all boards and committees where the DP is by virtue of office a member (i.e. District Finance Committee, District Advisory Committee, Field NYI Council).
- 4. To attend those events sponsored by the Field or General Levels (i.e. The District President's Leadership Conference sponsored by NYI Ministries).
- 5. To encourage the churches and/or local NYI organizations to pay in full their assigned department budget.

Note: In the event that the DP cannot attend, he may appoint someone to attend these events in his stead.

Executive Committee

The Executive Committee of the DNYI Council is comprised of the District President and Vice President, elected at the NYI Convention, as well as the secretary and the treasurer, appointed by the District NYI Council.

The Executive Committee meets to handle the business of the DNYI Council during the time in between council meetings as deemed necessary and reports decisions made to the full Council.

Bible Quizzing

What: The district offers a quizzing program consisting of multiple quizzes held at different locations around the East Ohio District. Although the main purpose is to gain a deeper knowledge of the Bible, the program is competitive in nature and teams have the opportunity to compete around the district, field, and nation.

When: The district quizzing program holds seven events from September until the District Quiz Finals in the spring of each year, quizzes begin at 9:00 a.m. Dates of district and field quizzes are listed in the back of the handbook. All teams are urged to attend the Tri-State meet at MVNU in November.

Where: Bible quizzing takes place in various locations around the district. See the list of dates and locations in the back of the handbook.

There are a certain amount of fees involved with District Quizzing, the Quizzing Director will advertise these. Quizzers should be in 6th - 12th grades or recently graduated from high school and not yet attending college. Quizzers who are active in their local youth ministry and who quiz at the team finals in March will be eligible for placement on a district team.

- Tri-state quiz: \$35.00 per team entry fee, \$5.00 discount for bringing any blue or computer working jump seats, \$5.00 discount per team for multiple team entries from the same church
- District finals: \$3 per quizzer, \$10 per team

THE CHANGES ...

C4 2018 was incredible! With over 350 people in attendance, we were right at 100% Camp Cotubic capacity. So, because we are expecting to see an increase in attendance this year, we had to make a few changes in order to make sure we don't have to turn people away from summer camp. Keep reading for details on these changes – the biggest things you (the youth leader/parent) need to be aware of are the *change in dates and the change in our registration process*.

Change in camp dates:

Remember how I said we were at 100% capacity at C4 2018? What I mean by this is that Camp Cotubic told us that we could not fit any more people in the camp facilities. Well, we don't like the idea of not being able to grow, so we had to find a creative solution – here's what we came up with:

We will be hosting two camps! Both camps will be identical – same speaker, same band, same activities, same schedule, same everything! Doing it this way allows us the opportunity to continue growing as we have been over the last few years. The dates for the two camps are:

Camp A: Sunday, June 23 – Wednesday, June 26 Camp B: Wednesday, June 26 – Saturday, June 29

You and your group will select and promote one of the above camps to attend (they are *not* split up by age or district). It is up to the leadership of your local ministry to determine whether they would like to promote Camp A or Camp B.

Change in registration process:

Registration is on a first come basis. Meaning, for example, if your church plans to attend Camp A, but you send in the registration for your church after Camp A has already hit capacity, you will be informed and invited to join us for Camp B. We recognize the possibility that one of the camps may fill up faster than the other. To streamline this process for students, leaders, and C4 staff, registration will be online this year. The only items that will be mailed will be your group registration paper, each person's medical liability form, and check. However, even all of those items can be submitted online via email (group tally and medical forms can be scanned and emailed, while *payments can be submitted online at nwonaz.org*).

COST AND PAYMENT SCHEDULE

Churches can reserve a spot in a non-transferrable & non-refundable deposit at any time prior to the early registration deadline. The cost is \$25 per student and will go towards the cost of their registration, but **does not lock** in the amount due. The final price for each person will still be based on when their account is paid in full. Simply send in completed forms with a \$25 deposit per student. This will reserve space for them through May 20th. At that time, any registration not paid in full will be lost.

MEDICAL RELEASE FORMS

We must have a <u>signed</u> medical release form on file for all in attendance. **No exceptions.** Be sure to mail (or email) these forms along with your registration fees and group tally form by the registration deadlines.

HOW MANY ADULTS SHOULD WE BRING?

We are requiring a minimum of 1 adult per 6 students and 1 adult per gender. So, if you have 5 girls and 1 boy, you'll need both a male and a female chaperone. Adult leaders are responsible to see that teens' medical needs are taken care of.
- 4. Take control and set boundaries BEFORE coming to fall retreat, especially with your male/female relationships. If a student chooses to come, they are expected to participate in ALL services and activities. Our security personnel are going to enforce this. Infractions may be cause for adult leaders to make arrangements for transportation home.
- 5. Registration begins at 6:00pm and ends at 8:00pm with an adult leader meeting at 8:00pm. We will have pizza before midnight.
- 6. Dismissal is after lunch on Sunday.
- 7. Hoodies will be PRE-SOLD ONLY. There may be a few extra available but there are no guarantees. If you want one be sure to order it. Hoodies are \$20.
- 8. NEW Laser Tag is available at a cost of \$15 per person. If you would like to guarantee yourself a spot you must sign up and pay with your registration, sign up early. Your spot will only be held if you have paid.
